



CVC Words Practice Pack

Learn to read simple three-letter words • Ages 4–6

For Parents

- CVC stands for Consonant-Vowel-Consonant (e.g., cat, dog, sun).
- Point to each letter and say the sound. Then blend them together.
- Have your child repeat each word 2–3 times.
- Practice 5–10 words per session, 10 minutes a day.
- Celebrate effort and progress, not perfection.
