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## For Parents

- Practice at home: "First pick up your toys, then wash your hands."

## One-Step Directions

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Read each direction to your child. Have them do what it says.

1. Draw a circle in the box below.

2. Write your name on the line.

3. Draw 3 stars anywhere on this page.

4. Color the box below your favorite color.

5. Draw a happy face in the box.




6. Put an X on the biggest shape (see the shapes below).




## Two-Step Directions

Follow BOTH steps in order.


1. First, draw a square. Then, color it red.




2. First, write the number 5. Then, draw 5 dots next to it.




3. First, draw a tree. Then, draw a bird on top of it.



4. First, draw a big circle. Then, draw a small circle inside it.




5. First, write your age. Then, draw that many stars.
