For Parents

- Rhyming means words that sound the same at the end.
- Read each word family together. Emphasize the ending sound.
- Ask: "Can you think of another word that rhymes?"
- Sing rhyming songs and read rhyming books daily.
- Clap when you hear words that rhyme!
