For Parents

- Sorting helps children organize information and see relationships.
- Start with sorting by one attribute (color, shape, or size).
- Use real objects at home: toys, socks, silverware, fruit.
- Ask your child to explain WHY items go together.
- Celebrate creative groupings – there can be more than one right answer.
